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Lisa Su, the President and CEO of AMD, has received numerous accolades, with one of the most prestigious being named Time Magazine's CEO of the Year for 2024. When he took the helm MAD's stock was low, but under her leadership, she multiplied it by a factor of over 10, turning the company into a key player in processors for gaming, AI, and data centers. Su's leadership has led AMD to surpass Intel as the stronger company in the semiconductor industry. Su is a prominent feminist figure, breaking gender barriers in th male-dominated tech field. As a woman in a top leadership role, she inspires women in STEM and demonstrates how intelligen-and perseverance can shatter glass ceilings. Her success is a powerful reminder of the importance of gender equality and female empowerment in tech.





Following Gisèle Pelicot's highly publicised trial, a mural in France emerged bearing the phrase "la honte change 2 camp" ("shame changes sides"). This phrase reflects Pelicot's wish to have her trial open to the public, despite its sensitive nature. She aimed to challenge the societal shame that Orten burdens rape victims, asserting that the shame should lie with the aggressor, not the victim.

The public largely supported Pelicot's stance, recognising her courageous act of seeking transparency in a case that could have been kept behind closed doors. Through her actions, Pelicot hoped to shift societal attitudes, encouraging victims to speak out and reclaim their dignity.

The mural, with its bold message, symbolises this shift. It calls for the cultural change that Pelicot championed—where shame is no longer placed on victims, but on the perpetrators. It's a tribute to her bravery and a reminder of the power of collective action in changing societal perception.
